CTACs Single Point of Contact

As part of the ongoing changes to how your health care concerns are managed by the Surgery. CTACs (community treatment and care services) who have been providing phlebotomy, chronic disease management and wound care at Blairgowrie Cottage Hospital since 2020 are expanding their operational scope. They now have a dedicated call handling team who will be available to make patient's appointments.

Until now all appointments were booked by the Surgery staff on additional software we had to run on our systems. Going forward when you receive your Chronic Disease review recall correspondence from us it will include the number to contact CTACs on so you can make your review appointment at your convenience. Similarly if you see a GP and they feel you require blood tests they will give you the number to contact and arrange your appointment. The same will apply to wound care.

The main benefit to patients from this change is the freedom to have your appointment whenever and wherever you want. CTACs hold clinics across Perth & Kinross and anyone can be booked in for an appointment at these sites e.g. If you work in Perth it might be easier for you to arrange an appointment in Perth rather than having to take time off work to be seen at Blairgowrie Cottage Hospital. Rest assured though, the clinics that have been running at Blairgowrie Cottage Hospital will keep going and the CTACs call-handlers will prioritise booking patients at their local CTACs clinic unless you request a slot elsewhere.

The surgery will still be able to access the appointment system that CTACs will be using. So can assist if you have any problems or queries and in some instances it may be easier if we directly book you in.

All these small changes are part of the Scottish governments care navigation plan to free up GPs and Practice Nurses to manage the more complex care problems that our aging population presents.
